Africa in Context: What to Make of 2023 (Already)!

Understanding and adapting to emerging trends and challenges across the African continent is crucial for businesses and financial institutions. In this panel discussion, we bring together industry experts who will provide valuable insights into the geopolitical, economic, and banking-specific challenges facing Africa today. Panelists will have the opportunity to explore the top conflicts identified by the Council on Foreign Relations, assessing their wider regional implications. The session will also feature an examination of the Economist Intelligence Unit's forecast for African economic growth, highlighting the areas that are bearing out and identifying potential sleeper risks. Esteemed representatives from Standard Bank and Eco-Bank will share their expertise on the opportunities and risks in the banking sector, discussing geographical and sectoral opportunities, risk mitigants for the bank and clients, and the challenges faced in adopting sustainable practices and technological advancements.

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Mind the Gap: Are You Connected?

Processes and controls are valuable to manage successful operations but when viewed from the outside can seem like unnecessary bureaucracy. How we understand and interpret the relevance of solutions and their time sensitivities will depend on perspectives, whether in the field or in a more centralized function. How do these different perspectives impact choices and solutions that we utilize? How do we work together to ensure the importance of the management of a solution isn't lost in translation? Issues include the implications for bank relationships and KYC versus the urgency of setting up solutions in the aftermath of a disaster etc. How can communication and relationships be leveraged to ensure both parties understand the comprehensive view and avoid gaps?

Geopolitical Risk in 2023 and Potential Financial Impacts to Aid Agencies

Serving the most vulnerable populations around the world is risky and can be very costly. Practitioners will learn about the types of financial exposure they face by operating in emerging markets, hear geopolitical updates from the eventful past year and be equipped with future considerations to contemplate with their leadership and donors.

Cultivating Your Greatest Assets: People

One of the most pressing issues leaders must address is how to attract, retain, and develop talent. Post COVID-19 issues have not only not only multiplied but have increased in complexity. Our speakers will dialogue on challenges and potential solutions and will engage the audience for participation on subjects such as managing remotely with engagement and inclusion, compensation structures with employees dispersed geographically, staff development, promotions and succession planning.

Lessons in Leadership

Being an effective leader includes important attributes, which are developed and adopted through intentional learning, engagement, and experience. Ms. Mizanga shares her leadership journey and the factors that have contributed to her success. She will highlight the importance of key attributes such as setting the vision, communication, problem solving, and relationship building and then focus on how to translate this into the future.

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Managing and Responding to Fraud in a Rapidly Changing Environment

Unravel the complexities of navigating fraud/waste/abuse with our insightful panel discussion. Learn from our panel of nonprofit and higher education industry experts as they discuss current fraud trends, risk exposure and valuable strategies to proactively identify, prevent, and address fraudulent activities. Discover how staying agile and adaptable can help your organization weather emerging threats and protect precious resources.

Reducing Risk by Cleaning House

This session highlights step-by-step actions that organizations need to take to become cyber-resilient. It merges professional guidance from insurance and legal experts into a comprehensive plan of action for securing corporate treasury against cyber-threats. Strategies presented in this session will be holistic and range from hi-tech to paper-based approaches. The speaker will discuss how treasuries should blend hi-tech and low-tech approaches to become effective in their cyber defenses, including tools such as tokenization, routine data hygiene exercises, and policy updated for 21st Century threats. Two key issues that will be explored are cyber extortion and electronic cyber-crime. Insights will be shared on best practices entities may undertake to position their cyber renewal, while maximizing coverage and minimizing premiums and the most common mistakes entities make in the cyber insurance process will be shared.

Navigating the Intersection of Insurance and Risk Management

Mission-driven organizations often take a unique approach to insurance and risk management programs. How do the programs overlap and where they should operate independently? We'll discuss the extent an insurance portfolio should have on the organization's practice of risk management, and how to initiate a risk management program at any stage of insurance maturation.

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Duty of Care: The Collaboration Between Insurance Carriers, Response Providers, and Crisis Management

Meeting an organization's duty of care requires careful coordination between an organization's internal crisis management teams and contracted third-party support. This session will explore the insurance policies and response providers integral to duty of care programs. We'll consider uninsured services and how they can responsibly factor into duty of care, as well as the benefits and drawbacks of both insured and uninsured solutions. Finally, we'll consider how to close the gap and minimize financial uncertainty of unaffiliated response providers by integrating them with insurance programs.

2023 and Beyond... Managing Through the Uncertainty of the Insurance Market

Take a glimpse into the future by examining rising geographic and geopolitical factors and consider underwriters' concerns that impact our coverage placement. After a period of rate increases, it's time to review premium considerations to better understand trends and premium cost factors. Finally, there will be an examination of insurance company challenges to make connections with our coverage placement and establish a renewal game plan.

Integrating Risk Management into an Organization: A Practical Approach

Organizations often focus on insurance coverage but lack an understanding of how risk management and mitigation integrate into a successful insurance solution. Learn from your fellow risk practitioners the practical applications at other mission-driven organizations and the discipline of risk and insurance management. Various phases of risk and insurance program maturation will be explored to understand the dynamics of a resilient risk management program, both for local and global operations. We'll consider the challenges of improving the program, and outline ways to maximize efforts to engage colleagues to serve as critical risk management allies.

Professional / Management Liability: Opportunities and Challenges to Maximize Coverage

Management liability can be a challenge to understand. Common exclusions of D&O policies will be explored to better grasp their impact and how our program should be structured to address those gaps, whether through endorsements, policies for unique risks, or non-insurance risk treatment plans. As mission-driven organizations, we'll dive into the nuances of professional liability and vicarious exposure in the face of confusing and sometimes contradictory demands

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from donors, and we'll consider the management liability needs for our country and field offices, exploring the connections and gaps with our overarching master insurance programs.

Contractual Risk Transfer: Getting it Right

Broker partner relationships are critical, and insurance and risk managers often rely on the guidance of those partners for contractual risk decision-making. Hear from brokers their best guidance in understanding common indemnification clauses and how they can vary from one jurisdiction to another. Understand the commonalities and conflicts between a donor or client's requirements and the terms on standard insurance policies. When it comes to flow-down requirements for our sub-awardees, grantees or contractors, what do the carriers need to know, and how does that impact coverage? How do decisions for coverage terms and clauses factor into our status as insured or just plain uninsured?

Leslie Archambeault is a human rights attorney and international policy specialist with over 19 years of experience in the areas of humanitarian law and policy, international human rights law, including children's rights, and conflict prevention and peacebuilding. Leslie is currently Managing Director, Humanitarian Policy at Save the Children where she leads on policy analysis and advocacy on all of Save the Children's humanitarian policy and advocacy efforts with the U.S. government across crisis response and thematic workstreams. She was previously Senior Director (Acting) Global Development Policy, and Director

of Gender Policy and Advocacy at Save the Children. In March 2021, Leslie was named one of the 100 most influential people on Gender Policy globally by *Apolitical*.

Previous to her work with Save the Children, Leslie served as Plan International's Global Humanitarian Policy and Advocacy lead (deployable), where she led on federation-wide the development, implementation, and coordination of crisis specific and thematic advocacy efforts the country and international policy level, including related to the UN Security Council's Children and Armed Conflict Agenda, forced displacement and the Global Compact on Refugees, gender and GBV in emergencies, and education in emergencies. She has worked for the conflict prevention and peacebuilding unit of the UNDP's Regional Hub for Arab States where she was responsible for crisis specific and regional/sub-regional conflict analyses and has also led research, policy analysis, and advocacy on issues under the Women, Peace and Security Agenda for UN Women's Peace and Security Team and Human Rights Watch's Women's Rights Division, including on gender-based violence in emergencies, forced marriage and sexual slavery in conflict contexts, and transitional justice.

Sebastian has been the Group Head for the Financial Institutions and International Organizations (FIIO) client segment at the Ecobank Group since May 2010. Sebastian holds a BA in Economics & Accounting from the University of Ghana, a MSc. in Shipping, Trade & Finance from the Sir Costas Grammenos International Centre for Shipping, Trade & Finance at the Cass Business School, City University, London.

Sly has led numerous forensic analyses for several international non-governmental organizations ("INGO's") and government contractors, including field work domestically in the US, and in Africa and the Middle East. Sly has also assisted with defective pricing analyses relating to federal contracts which are subject to the Truth and Negotiations Act (TINA). This included examining a client's pricing strategy for its federal awards, determining the contractor had more current, complete and accurate cost and pricing data, quantifying a Rough Order of Magnitude of potential

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overcharging to the federal government, and then providing recommendations to prevent such practices from occurring again in the future.

Moojan Behziz is responsible for Treasury at the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation where she works primarily on global banking and insurance. She started her career at PWC, responsible for tax preparation of tax-exempt organizations. Following her work with PWC, Moojan spent 13 years at Amgen, Inc. and held positions of increasing responsibility mainly within global treasury, which included cash management, capital planning, interest rate and foreign exchange risk management, and corporate insurance.
